## A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR

At the end of **1 Samuel**, after Samuel died, Saul wisely evicted all of the evil seers and mediums from Israel. Shortly thereafter, the Philistine army encamped around Saul threatening war, and he was afraid. So he prayed to the Lord seeking wisdom for what to do, but the Lord did not answer him by the time that Saul expected an answer. So, foolishly, Saul told one of his servants to go and find one of the seers that had been cast out of Israel, so that he might ask *her* what to do.

When God didn't answer Saul, Saul turned to what he knew was wrong, seeking the direction of a witch... which showed just how unfaithful Saul truly was.

How many times do we the same thing? When God doesn't answer our prayer, or give us direction when we want it, we move ahead on our own, acting in our own wisdom, rather than waiting of God's wisdom.

The truth is that when God tarries, He always does so for a reason. Sometimes it might be so that we can learn how to have faith, and sometimes it may be that we're part of a much bigger picture and plan that we don't know about. Whatever the reason may be, we need to learn to be patient, and to wait for God's direction and wisdom.


