

^{~153} Look on my affliction and deliver me, for I do not forget yourlaw. ¹⁵⁴ Plead my cause and redeem me; give me life according to your promise! ¹⁵⁵ Salvation is far from the wicked, for they do not seek your statutes. ¹⁵⁶ Great is your mercy, O LORD; give me life according to your rules. ¹⁵⁷ Many are my persecutors and my adversaries, but I do not swerve from your testimonies. ¹⁵⁸ I look at the faithless with disgust, because they do not keep your commands. ¹⁵⁹ Consider how I love your precepts! Give me life according to your steadfast love. ¹⁶⁰ The sum of your word is truth, and every one of your righteous rules endures forever."

It's so very easy to look at those around us who don't know the Lord (*the faithless*, v158), and become disgusted at the way they behave. However, we can't allow the actions of the ungodly to cause us such angst. The truth is that they don't play by the same set of rules that we do. The Bible is not their guide, so we shouldn't expect them to live by it.
